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The war scenario of the conflict in Ukraine

The West is "content" with applying "the broadest sanctions in history," according to President Biden. The bad news is that Russia will have to pay – once again, the most expensive price to prevent imperial expansion, this time from the United States.



The UN Security Council failed to pass a resolution against Russia, which vetoed it. This is how the global power structure works, as long as it is not changed and something better emerges. The truth is that the United Nations, as it stands today, has no reason to exist, it is incapable of avoiding war, much less genocide when the one who commits it is a global power. Last week, one thing led to another, and faced with the impossibility for multilateral organizations, international law, dialogue and negotiation to avoid human

extermination, war (which is the continuation of politics by other means) made its appearance as a way to enshrine the first human right: the right to life. How paradoxical!



In these first days of the so-called special operation of the Russian Armed Forces, the fundamental feature has been the overwhelming and smooth advance of the Armed Forces of Russia and its allies in Donetsk and Luhansk into the depth of Ukrainian territory. Today's report from the Russian Defense Ministry shows that 1533 military infrastructure facilities, including 54 checkpoints and communication posts, 39 air defense complexes, 52 radars, 484 tanks, 58 aircraft, 63 multiple rocket launcher systems, 217 artillery pieces, 336 vehicles and 47 drones have been destroyed. A devastating result for any army in a week of "combat." Meanwhile, the main activity of the Ukrainian armed forces has been to surrender, it is not known if it is because they are not willing to immolate themselves by Washington and Brussels, out of fear or because of the overwhelming superiority of Russia.

The Russian operation is designed in 4 directions:

1. The Southern Front acting from Crimea, the Sea of Azov and the Black Sea advances northward, taking the important cities of Kherson and Melitopol and have blocked any possibility of Ukrainian naval forces in the Sea of Azov. They also captured the Zaporozhie nuclear power plant.
2. The Central Front, in coordination with the Donetsk and Luhansk Defense Forces have broken the defenses of the nationalists, advancing westward, liberating about 50% of their territories in the prospect of uniting in the coming hours with the Russian forces of the Northeastern Front.

3. North-Eastern Front. Attacking from the Belogorod-Kursk region they have occupied a wide front of around 400 km and a depth of between 40 and 100 km taking Kharkiv, the second city of the country. Its right flank is rapidly approaching Kiev from the northeast.
4. Northwestern front. Breaking in from northern Russia and Belarus, they have evolved rapidly by taking the city of Chernihiv and the abandoned Chernobyl nuclear power plant, approaching the capital and entering its suburbs from the north and west.

The scene of the fighting shows Ukraine's total inability to withstand the Russian onslaught. It is striking that compared to the crushing destruction of military means, the human losses have been negligible given the magnitude of the operation in forces and means. So far, Russian casualties reach 17% of Ukrainian casualties. The greatest resistance has been on the part of the fascist Nazi battalions to whom NATO has given the endorsement to continue massacring the civilian population that until now has put the highest number of dead and wounded.



In the diplomatic field, the Ukrainian government is delaying the negotiation hoping that the EU and NATO will come to its aid so it tries to "buy time" assuming that the sanctions will erode and collapse Russia's internal economy generating unrest and breaking the internal unity of the country. Neither one nor the other has happened. On the contrary, according to the pollster FOM, the level of trust of citizens in President Putin increased from 60 to 71% in one week.



World diplomacy and the United Nations powerless in the face of the war crisis
The Russian advance in the field of military actions means that every day the negotiating capabilities of the Ukrainian government are smaller. At the moment, it only has the support of the West and NATO and the impact that sanctions against Moscow may have. Hence Russia's urgent need not to get bogged down in the military arena.

The support of the United States, NATO and the EU to Ukraine, in addition to manifesting itself in the field of sanctions, is limited to the shipment of "weapons, money and humanitarian aid" according to President Biden, but NATO military contingents will not participate. In this context, the weapons that are being sent would have to be used by Ukrainians who wish to fight, the problem is that these are being annihilated or are surrendering.

This entails a new and greater danger: the weapons are reaching the fascist Nazi gangs that are receiving them without control, so once again, as in Afghanistan, Syria, Libya and Yemen in a few weeks they will have swelled the ranks of international terrorism, generating a military component for the ultra-right political forces that are emerging in Europe some of which already have parliamentary representation and control of local governments. This time, the terrorists will not have to cross any sea or great distances to settle on European territory. There they are.



To this extent, the prospect at the negotiating table is not very auspicious for Ukraine since – as was said before – its capabilities are undermined over time. That is why Ukraine and in particular Zelensky also need a prompt solution, since the prolongation of the conflict will put its own stability and that of the government at stake. It would be undesirable for him, if in the end, it is another administration that ends up negotiating with Russia, in a country devastated economically and tired of an unnecessary war, only fed by a xenophobic and racist minority that has found sustenance from Washington and Brussels to carry out its own designs.

The explanation for NATO's refusal to engage militarily in the conflict may stem from the fact that victory in a modern war is not given by the possession and/or control of the seas as has occurred over the past five centuries. To that extent, the possession of aircraft carriers and military bases throughout the planet does not guarantee superiority in military terms.

The increasing range and flight speed of intercontinental missiles, but also medium- and short-range missiles, makes it unnecessary to approach a target in order to annihilate or neutralize it. That is where the war power lies in recent times. In this area, the possession of the technology that has made it possible to build hypersonic missiles is the decisive element.

In this dispute, only three countries: Russia, China and the United States have achieved higher standards than any other country, while Europe is light years away from approaching a technology that allows it to compete in this field. In the triad of leaders, it is precisely Russia that has achieved the technique, know-how and a scientific development so advanced that it has managed to build missiles that fly at more than 6,000 km. per hour, being also impossible to detect by radars whenever they move at very low altitude.

On this matter, it is worth knowing the opinion of Justin Bronk, a researcher at the Royal United Services Institute in Great Britain who believes that: "Chinese and Russians are not concerned about the current missile defense capabilities of the United States, but about the next phases." He continues: "With this technology, they are trying to send a message in some way deterrent to the United States. They try to tell him, 'It's useless for them to continue down that path, to develop a new generation of ballistic missile defense, because we've opened another path.'" From his point of view, although Washington has a clear defensive advantage, this is not enough to neutralize an eventual contemporary multiple attack.

Perhaps this is why last Tuesday, March 1, in an appearance before the Armed Services Committee of the United States House of Representatives – in the midst of the Russian offensive in Ukraine – the head of the North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD, for its acronym in English), Aviation General Glen D. VanHerck, He noted that China is 10 times ahead in the development of hypersonic weapons. It could also be remembered that Russia is much more advanced than China.

Already in November last year, the Russian armed forces successfully tested the hypersonic missile 3M22 Zircon (Tsirkon, in Russian) that can be used from a Tu-22M3 bomber, from a land platform and from surface units of the Navy, reaching a speed of between 10 thousand and 11 thousand kilometers per hour. A few days after this test, serial production of such a weapon began.

Perhaps it was this that led NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg to say that the organization would not send troops to Ukraine, leaving Kiev to its free will. The problem for NATO is that it is not the same to produce a genocide against an unarmed people as to have to face one of the most powerful armies in the world, the victors of Napoleon and Hitler.

That is why the West is "content" with applying "the broadest sanctions in history" in the words of President Biden. They seem to have no other "argument." The bad news is that Russia will have to pay – once again – and just like during the Second World War, the most expensive price to prevent imperial expansion, this time from the United States. The good news is that the United States and NATO for the first time lost a war as a bloc, facing another global power.

A little sense emerged from Joe Biden's troubled brain when he accepted that the other option was to start World War III. Much more sanity was expressed by Germany's economy minister Robert Habeck who in an act, it is not known whether of realism or brazenness and cynicism said that sanctions against Russia will do enormous damage to its economy but that they had to make sure "not to impose sanctions that we ourselves could not bear." In clear words, that means that they must make the Russian people suffer extremely, but not so much that President Putin gets angry and turns off the gas key.

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
