

Ukraine: end of the Zionist concept of "anti-Semitism" (I)

In the light of recent events it is necessary to know that in Ukraine, world Zionism in alliance with the imperial forces of the West has acted with premeditation and treachery.



By falsifying the Bible and making use of a historical misrepresentation, Zionism has succeeded in linking the concept of "anti-Semitism" with that of discrimination, persecution, mistreatment and exclusion of Jews. Nothing more false. The term Semitic says relationship with those who according to Genesis are descendants of Shem, son of Noah. Thus, the Semitic identity was always throughout history a cultural and linguistic link. Thus, both Arabs and Jews are Semites.



Only in the nineteenth century did it begin to be given a racial connotation, when the correct thing would be to refer to peoples who spoke some of the dialects that emanated from a common origin. There is no homogeneous "Semitic race" since the Semitic peoples (plural) only had in common a dialect used by nomadic pastoral tribes and a patriarchal structure.

In recent times, Zionism gave the concept a racial character in order to establish an exclusivity that would allow it to justify its expansionist, violent and servile policy to imperial interests during the Cold War. In this way they managed to sow the idea that any criticism of Israel was an attack on the Jews as well as a manifestation of anti-Semitism.

In this way it is a question of explaining the annihilation of around 6 million Jews by the Nazi regime during the Second World War in a repudiable action of clear racial content. But, if we were to stick to this concept, we would have to qualify in the same way the extermination of the Palestinian people (a Semitic people) by the State of Israel. Similarly, if we stick to the modern conceptualization that has been given to the term, we would have to say that the action of Zionism in Palestine is the most complete expression of anti-Semitism on the planet.



However, the concept has spread, giving veracity to the meaning that Zionism has managed to establish. This notion is what is being signed his death certificate in Ukraine when Jewish leaders of that country, Israel and the United States have colluded to justify and support the action of Nazi gangs in the European country.

Although these detachments carrying Nazi symbols have publicly manifested their anti-Jewish disposition, burned synagogues and destroyed Hebrew symbols, the Jewish president of Ukraine, Israeli leaders and some of the main Jewish leaders of the United States such as Secretary of State Anthony Blinken, Undersecretary of State Wendy Sherman, Avril Haines, Director of National Intelligence and Janet Yellen, Secretary of the Treasury among others, have come in an uproar to support and stimulate the actions of the Ukrainian government that is propped up by Nazi gangs in that country. Using their language, it could be said that these Jews express anti-Semitic thought and act according to it, with conviction and depth.

Already in the days of the 2014 coup d'état, the ultra-nationalist group Sector Right, the façade organ of fascism that includes the followers of Svoboda, Tryzub and the National Assembly of Ukraine made open threats against Jews. Rifle in hand, Nazi leader Oleksandr Muzychko laid out his dogma bluntly: "fight against communists, Jews and Russians as long as you have blood in your veins."



In the light of recent events it is necessary to know that in Ukraine, world Zionism in alliance with the imperial forces of the West has acted with premeditation and treachery. Already in March 2014, less than a month after the coup d'état in Ukraine, the Washington Post columnist, Eugene Robinson, who is far from being pro-Russian or a friend of President Putin, believed that before the visit that Arseni Yatsenyuk would have to make to the United States, recently appointed Ukrainian prime minister after the coup d'état, he was to be asked "why do several far-right ultra-nationalists have such prominent roles in Ukraine's new government?"

In his article, Robinson questioned whether Oleksandr Sych, one of the three deputy prime ministers, was a member of the neo-Nazi "Svoboda" party, whose leader had stated that Ukraine during Yanukovych's previous government, was being controlled by a "Moscow Jewish mafia." He also recalled that members of Svoboda headed the ministries of agriculture and environment while Andriy Parubiy has been appointed Secretary of the Committee on Security and National Defense

It is worth remembering that the <u>World Jewish Congress itself</u>, an organization that is <u>based in New York and that assumes itself as the diplomatic arm of the Jewish people</u>, <u>asked the European Union to consider banning what it considered neo-Nazi parties in Ukraine</u>, including Svoboda.

In the same way, the Kiev-based American journalist David L. Stern shed light on the matter by publishing on December 13, 2014 a long article in the BBC whose only title exposed the substance of the matter: "Ukraine minimizes the role of the extreme right in the conflict." In such a writing, Stern refutes the characterization as "fascist junta formed by neo-Nazis and anti-Semites", which already at that time made Russia of the new government of Ukraine. The argument was that no party of what he calls "far right" had exceeded 5% in the elections although he warned that if they had joined they would have exceeded that threshold. He claimed that only one minister was linked to those parties and that the speaker of the parliament was Jewish, but warned that Ukrainian politics was not "completely free of fascism" noting that no one talked about it so as not to "provide fuel to the Russian propaganda machine."

The lengthy article stated that denying such a situation allowed the Nazis to go unnoticed by making Ukrainians unaware that they exist or even did not know "what a neo-Nazi or fascist really is, or what they represent." President Petro Poroshenko then granted Ukrainian citizenship to the Belarusian Nazi. Serhiy Korotkykh is a member of the farright Russian National Unity party and also a founding member of the neo-Nazi National Socialist Society (NSS) in Russia, an organization whose goal, according to Ukrainian academic Anton Shekhovtsov, was to "prepare for a race war."

Stern then goes on to explain the characteristics of the Azov Battalion, linked to the Svoboda Party. It says it "is run by the extremist organization Patriot of Ukraine, which considers Jews and other minorities 'subhuman' and calls for a white Christian crusade against them, sports three Nazi symbols on its insignia: a modified Wolf's Hook, a black sun (or "Hakensonne") and the title Black Corps, which was used by the Waffen SS." The Azov battalion is the only paramilitary group in the world that has formal membership in the armed and security forces of a country, in this case as a detachment of the National Guard. Its birth dates back to the disappearance of the Soviet Union when fascist ideology regained strength giving rise to organizations such as the Congress of Ukrainian Nationalists (KUN) and the Social-National Party of Ukraine, the germ of the Azov Battalion.

In this area, it is worth highlighting the role of Andriy Biletsky, leader of the far-right fascist National Corps party, who became the one under the slogan that Ukraine must "lead the white races of the world in a final crusade ... against the subhumans led by the Semites."

In his article, Stern adds that the Azov is not the only neo-Nazi organization in Ukraine as there are more than 50 volunteer groups that have government support. He mentions for example that Interior Minister Arsen Avakov and his deputy, Anton Gerashchenko actively supported Biletsky's parliamentary candidacy. In the same way, he recalls that Vadim Troyan, a senior official of Azov and a member of Patriots of Ukraine, was appointed police chief of the Kiev region.

Stern ends his writing by opining that he believes Ukraine is not run by fascists, but states that "far-right extremists seem to be dabbling by other means, such as the country's police department." Asserting that Ukrainians are very misinformed about this," he asks. "Why doesn't anyone want to tell you?"

It seems contradictory, but in this way the end of the Zionist concept of "anti-Semitism" is brewing. Next week, in the second part of this article, we will explain it
